## **About the Examination:**

**Application/Testing Fee:** 

The test will take place on Thursday, February 25 at 2:30 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. at the Holiday Inn Conference Center in Stevens Point. Those taking the examination do not necessarily need to register and attend the Conference, but it is highly encouraged as a means to prepare for the examination. Additional tests will be scheduled as needed both this year and in future years.

The Master Installer examination is an open-book test and you are free to use books, calculators, etc. to complete the examination. The focus is on the ability to recognize potential problems and to find solutions for those problems. You may use devices that connect to the Internet to search for answers, but you may not use these devices to communicate with other individuals. You may not take any photos in the exam room. Suggested study materials include manufacturer training manuals, tech bulletins, text books, IGSHPA manuals, and state codes.

## **Continuing Education:**

If you are successful in achieving the Master Installer designation, you will be required to document continuing education during your three-year renewal cycle.
