Your Action Is Needed NOW!

Geothermal Tax Credits To Be Acted On Soon.

NOW is the time to act to help extend the federal tax credits for geothermal heat pumps!

Ever since Congress extended tax credits late last year for solar technologies, GEO has been pushing hard for an amendment to correct that oversight for BOTH commercial AND residential geothermal heat pump installations.

An amendment, which will give geothermal equal treatment with solar, is now moving RAPIDLY in the Senate.

GEO needs your help NOW to make sure the amendment is approved - WITH FEDERAL TAX CREDITS FOR RESIDENTIAL GEOTHERMAL HEAT PUMP INSTALLATIONS - under Section 25D of the tax code.

TIME IS SHORT!

We have only a short window to make our voices heard, including today (Friday, April 8) and Monday (April 11).

Here's the message:

"Please support the amendment to the FAA Funding Authorization bill that will level the playing field for renewable energy technologies and include residential (25D) for geothermal heat pump installations, similar to tax credit treatment given to solar by Congress last December. That simply means moving the sunset date for residential geothermal heat pump tax credits in 25D to

the end of 2021, with a phase-out. My company and the entire industry will suffer if this legislative fix is not enacted."

Although the list of key Senate contacts does not include those from our state, it's still a good idea to make a contact and let your voice be heard. In addition, you can contact any of the Senators listed, knowing that your call is important, but may not have impact equal to that of a constituent.
